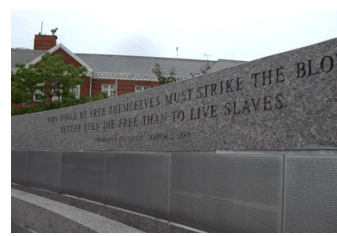

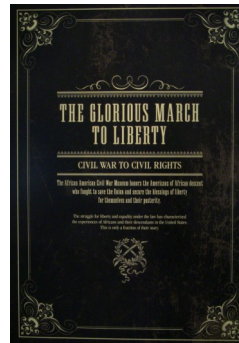

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Glorious March to Liberty: Civil War to Civil Rights
Runtime: 45 min to 1 hr. Grades 4-12
This program takes students through the causes and consequence of the Civil War and the arming of African American soldiers.

The Civil War Soldier
Runtime: 45 min to 1 hr. Grades K-3
This program introduces students to the Civil War and what life was like for the typical soldier through an interactive presentation.

Story Hour
Runtime: 1 hr Grade: Pre-K-3
Story hour engages our youngest visitors in historic objects and museum settings by using traditional and contemporary stories of the Civil War and Civil Rights.
